- ii. Resume Sport Coordinator

Evangelos Leventis and his Team are responsible for Organising the Archery Competition for the NatWest Island Games XII, Rhodes 2007. Archery is a "new" sport on the Island!! Due to the efforts of the Rhodes Island Games Association the first archery athletes started to train the last few years. Evaggelos, a lawyer first got involved with the sport as an athlete and due to his enthusiasm he has contributed to the organization and development of the sport since its first steps and is now the Sport Coordinator for Archery.

2. Rules

- a. IF rules. The Competition of all sports at the Rhodes 2007 NatWest ISLAND GAMES will follow the International rules set by the respective International Federation. The IF rules for Archery can be read in the website under the address:

- b. By laws. According to the IGA Constitution separate rules for the Island Games are written and revised by the Technical Committee after the end of the last Island Games Competition. The IGA Executive Committee is responsible to approve any changes. The finals bylaws approved for the Rhodes 2007 NatWest Island Games and were published in October 2006 by IGA are:

Archery By-laws

1 Rules of Competition

1.1 Men

Individual events for Recurve and Compound bows determined by any FITA recognised Target Archery Round.

1.2 Women

Individual events for Recurve and Compound bows determined by any FITA recognised Target Archery Round.

1.3 Team

Team events for Recurve and Compound bows determined by any FITA recognised Target Archery Round. All competitors must have competed in the individual events. The combined scores for the two highest scoring men and one highest scoring woman will be used to determine the result of, or the seeding for, the team competition depending upon the round being shot.

2 Duration of Competition

The programme should be a minimum of 4 days in length including 1 practice day.

3 Notification of Competition format

The next host Island must announce the proposed programme for the next Games not later than the Post Games Technical Committee meeting at the previous Games.



4 Dress Regulations

FITA rules strictly apply.

5 Competitor Affiliation

All competitors must be registered members of an Association or Club affiliated to a National Association who shall be affiliated to FITA.

7 Competition Officials

7.1 The competition will be controlled by suitably qualified judges holding qualifications recognised by the host island and affiliated to the International Archery Federation

3. Competition Facilities

a. Description:

The Competition Facility is located in an ideal place; the field is surrounded by trees, requirement that is also mentioned in the technical requirements of the International Federation. The supporting facilities will be built in the following year. Twenty (20) targets (Domino) will be placed in the field of play. In this facility the Olympic Archery team of Taiwan trained before the Athens 2004 Olympic Games with the result of winning one Silver medal in team event men and one bronze in team event women.

b. All competition venues will open on the 29 June 2007 and will close according to the end of Competition of each sport

4. Competition Clothing

We encourage all member island's athletes that will participate in the Archery Tournament to wear light cotton clothing, including hats due to the warm climate at that time of the year. Also, we encourage the member islands to print the initials of the island in the back of the t shirts to help the spectators to follow the competitions better.

5. Extra Services

a. Water will be available for the athletes for each round. Athletes will receive their bottle of water from the Games office before each round.

b. In order to provide our participating islands the best possible service, there will be a weather forecast distributed on the beginning off every days session at the venue and at the Sports Information Centre.

6. Transportation

Transportation during the Rhodes 2007 NatWest Island Games is organised and provided, to accredited persons, by the Organising Committee. Transportation services begin for the arrival of the teams until their departure. Officially, the transportation to the Venues and the Games Village will start on the 29 July until the 6 July 2007. A transport plan has been organised and includes Transport from and to the Airport, four Shuttle Bus lines, direct transport to venues as well as direct transport to venues not included in the shuttle lines. The organising committee will try to fulfill all transport needs to and from the venues according to the needs of each Sport. See the shuttle bus map on page 22.



7. Sport Party

It is tradition in the Island Games history that each sport does its own separate party. The Party for Archery will be held on Thursday at 21:00.

8. Test Event

For the best preparation of the Rhodes 2007 NatWest Island Games the Organising Committee will cooperate with the local sport organisations to organise events to test the planning of the Games.
